

EUREKA 160th ANNIVERSARY


Whilst the Eureka Sesquicentenary Celebrations in 2004 were a major event in Ballarat, this year – the 160th Anniversary is extremely important and broader as the story of Eureka and its ideals of democracy are being taken to the nation.

Events in Ballarat, Melbourne, Canberra, Sydney and later in Geelong will discuss those ideals of democracy which Eureka advocated and stood to defend and what relevance Eureka has to our contemporary democracy which in Australia needs to be better valued and protected from the many challenges that confront it today.

DEMANDING DEMOCRACY - A EUREKA'S CHILDREN EVENT

As indicated in the Eureka Calendar of Events at Ballarat, Eureka's Children will present an event titled "Demanding Democracy" on Saturday 6th December starting at 1.30pm, which will take the following format:

- People will assemble @ 1.30pm at the bronze Eureka Circle which is outside the Museum where our President will welcome them and present a brief story of this event
- they will then walk down the Pathway to the Fallen and stop briefly at the Memorial to the Fallen and at the nearby Memorial to the Pikeman's Dog
- participants will then proceed to the Museum theatre where from 2pm to 3.30pm, 12 characters will present a theatrical narrative of how the diggers and their representatives pursued democratic actions in their Demands for Democracy. Dr Anne Beggs Sunter; our script writer, interlinks this narrative story throughout the presentation.




Along the Pathway to the Fallen are some 33 trees planted in remembrance to the fallen at the Eureka Stockade. We will have a Guard of Honour with a person standing in front of each tree and indicating (with a sign) the name of that fallen person and the country they came from. People from the Ballarat Irish Club have agreed to stand in front of the 13 Irish who died at Eureka.

Also, as the leader of the Pikemen was a Hanrahan – We will have a Hanrahan descendant at the Memorial to the Pikeman's Dog to say a few words.





STITCHING A LIFE SIZE REPLICA OF THE EUREKA FLAG



Eureka's Children were delighted to assist the Museum of Australian Democracy at Eureka by inviting our members and friends to participate in a project to replicate in its fullness, the original and life size Eureka Flag using the original sewing methods.

Also taking part were members of the public along with needlecraft experts from the Embroiders Guild of Ballarat and the Ballarat Quilters.

This was a wonderful opportunity for descendants of Eureka's Children and others to imprint their identity on a unique replica of a major Australian heritage icon of the Eureka event and its ideals of democracy. It is recognized, identified and commemorated as the flag of the people.

Over 150 people have participated in one of the 7 sessions held on various weekends in July and August. The replica Flag measures four metres by 2.6 metres

The Flag has been stitched as part of the 160th Anniversary Commemoration of the Eureka Stockade and will be proudly unfurled on the day.

To complement the original Flag which is on permanent display in the Museum (and which only 60% is conserved) MADE is also pursuing a program of finding different parts of the Flag and showing them next to the original.

Known as the Flag of the Southern Cross, the Eureka Flag was first hoisted on Bakery Hill at a Monster meeting on 29th November 1854. John Wilson published an eyewitness account in 1855 of this event and in which was stated...

"Its maiden appearance was a fascinating experience to behold. There is no flag in Europe, or in the civilized world, half so beautiful and Bakery Hill as being the first place where the Australian ensign was first hoisted will be recorded in the deathless and indelible pages of history. The Flag is silk, blue ground with a large silver cross, no device or arms, but all exceedingly chaste and natural"

MADE FOR MEMORIES



Eureka's Children are involved in and are assisting the Museum of Australian Democracy at Eureka in a project titled 'MADE FOR MEMORIES'.

This project, funded by the Helen MacPherson Smith Trust and the Victorian Government, is about collecting and presenting the important and fascinating stories of people descended from those involved in or associated with the Eureka Stockade events. The project involves the video taping of these stories and then exhibiting them on the touch tables at the Museum and online as well as being added to MADE's digital collection.



The stories so far assembled, will be on exhibition during the 160th Eureka Anniversary celebrations.

Eureka's Children are vital to this program as they can provide fascinating information from their great data base collection of Eureka ancestor's stories and also provide introductions to our descendant members for MADE to interview.

One of the project stories for instance, is about the escape of the injured Peter Lalor from Ballarat to Geelong after the Eureka Stockade Battle. Major characters involved in this escape include:

- Peter Lalor – The leader of the diggers at the Eureka Stockade
- Alicia Dunne - Peter's fiancé and school teacher in Geelong.
- Patrick Carroll and his sons; Michael and John. - Carriers who transported Peter Lalor to Geelong
- John and Margaret Moore Licensee of the Young Queen Hotel where Peter sought refuge.
- The Doctors who amputated Peter Lalor's arm.


Descendants of these people were interviewed to tell this intriguing story. A story which has never been told in any detail before, except in family history, and which illustrates the great bravery of these ancestors who came together to transport and harbour a friend and fugitive on whom the Government had issued a 200 pound reward for information leading to his apprehension.

- Dr Clare Wright is an historian who has worked as a political speechwriter, university lecturer, historical consultant and radio and television broadcaster. Her first book, *Beyond the Ladies Lounge: Australia's Female Publicans*, garnered both critical and popular acclaim. She researched, wrote and presented the ABC television documentary *Utopia Girls*.

Clare won the 2014 Stella prize for her book, *The Forgotten Rebels of Eureka*. In the book she reveals that there were thousands of women on the goldfields and many of them were active in pivotal roles. But it is in the rebellion itself that the unbiddable women of Ballarat come into their own.
